


Home Rule Cities







Home Rule Authority

A home rule city may do anything authorized by its charter that is not specifically prohibited or preempted by the Texas Constitution or state or federal law; A general law city has no charter and may *only* exercise those powers that are specifically granted or implied by statute.





Annexation



Home Rule: unilateral annexation with state rules

General Law: mostly requested annexations with rules



Initiative, Referendum, and Recall

- Only home rule cities possess these powers
- Home Rule Charter gives authority
- Initiative: Citizens want an ordinance
- Referendum: Citizens want to repeal on ordinance
- Recall: Citizens want to remove one or more members of governing body

Texas Attorney General Opinion GA-0526

Sec. 51.012. ORDINANCES AND

REGULATIONS. The municipality may adopt an ordinance, act, law, or regulation, not inconsistent with state law, that is necessary for the government, interest, welfare, or good order of the municipality as a body politic

Dangerous Dogs

- Sec. 822.047. LOCAL REGULATION OF DANGEROUS DOGS. A county or municipality may place additional requirements or restrictions on dangerous dogs if the requirements or restrictions:
- (1) are not specific to one breed or several breeds of dogs; and
- (2) are more stringent than restrictions provided by this subchapter.
