


## FCC Broadband Map

## City Authority Over the Right-of-Way

- Cities have <u>exclusive control</u> over and under the public highways, streets, and alleys. Tex. Transp. Code §§ 311.001–311.002
- Other state laws, re: city authority over the ROW.

  Tex. Loc. Gov't Code §§ 283.001(b), 284.001(c), & 284.301(b);

  Tex. Util. Code §§ 66.011(a) & 66.016(b); & Tex. Transp. Code §§ 311.071 & 316.021
- Statutory authority\* or an agreement is needed to access the right-of-way. \*e.g., Tex. Local Gov't Code Ch. 283 or 284; or Tex. Util. Code Ch. 66

Ground Lease(s) for Shelters

## Compensation

#### Fair compensation for use of right-of-way

• Avoid an unconstitutional gift of public funds or thing of value. Tex. Const. Art. III § 52(a) & Art. XI § 3

#### Methods of compensation

- Percentage of gross revenues\*
- Number of connected customers\*\*
- Per linear foot rate





#### Deadlines and Milestones



## **Deadline examples**

32 months to <u>start</u> construction 60 months to <u>complete</u> construction



## Milestone examples

15% in Year 1 35% in Year 2

55% in Year 3 75% in Year 4

100% in Year 5

## Construction Methods


## Regulations

 Establish construction methods, including microtrenching, by <u>City</u> regulation, e.g., ROW construction manual, ordinance, etc.

#### Contract

- Explicitly require compliance with all applicable laws
- Do not approve specific types of construction methods in the contract

# Microtrenching Regulations - example

- Default rule: microtrenching is only allowed in the parkway.
- Microtrenching is allowed in asphalt streets, concrete streets, driveways, and sidewalks only with City approval.
- Microtrenching is not allowed on concrete streets designated as thoroughfares, major/minor arterials, major/minor collectors.
- Minimum 12-inch depth. City may require 16-inch depth to avoid endangering the health, safety, or welfare of the public or property.
- Trenches must be reinstated with like material, consistent with the site.

## Microtrenching Regulations - example [continued]

- When microtrenching is approved in the streets, sidewalks, or driveways, trenches must be cut in existing seams or joints.
- Microtrenching is not allowed in driveways of decorative stone, pavestone, or other unique non-concrete or non-asphalt material; must bore under driveway 24 inches deep.
- Trenches must be 3 feet behind the curb.
- Rebar, dowels, or other structural supports in concrete must not be cut.

## Pilot Project

#### Evaluate overall project and construction methods

#### Example:

- Within 90 days after execution of the agreement
- 2,000 linear feet
- Microtrenching different surfaces: asphalt, concrete, parkway, intersections
- Installing conduit
- Locating utilities
- Filling the trench
- City may terminate agreement if pilot project is not to City's satisfaction



# Ground Leases for Shelters



## Shelter Lease Area




Extend Lease Area to Street or Right-of-Way



Avoid Granting Easements in Lease

# Shelter Lease Area - example



## Term Length of Shelter Lease



Shorter term – ideally, less than 35 years (overall)



Longer term leases may qualify as a "sale or exchange" of land that triggers the state notice-and-bidding laws. Tex. Loc. Gov't Code § 272.001

#### Shelter Leases - Other Terms

Non-exclusive ground lease

Move shelters if
City needs to
use the land

List specific uses. No other uses allowed.
