Lack of Case Law

Chapter 252: Purchasing and Contracting Authority of Municipalities

Broad Applicability

- Applies to Expenditures => \$50,000 from one or more city funds
- May use:
 - Competitive Sealed Bidding or Competitive Sealed Proposals
 - Reverse Auction
 - Tex. Gov't Code ch. 2269
- Permits use of Competitive Sealed Proposals for goods or services
- Prior to bid, if not CSB, Council or Delegee must determine best value

Ch. 252 Competitive Sealed Proposals

- Best Value Considerations:
 - Purchase Price
 - Reputation of Goods or Services
 - Quality of Goods or Services
 - Extent to Which Both Meet City's Needs
 - Past Relationship
 - Impact to City's Ability to Comply with HUB Laws and Rules
 - Long-term Cost to City
 - Any Relevant Criteria
- Must Specify Relative Importance of Price & Other Factors

Chapter 252 – Procedures, Etc.

Procedures

- Public Notice
 - Advertising Requirements
- RFB/RFP Methodology
 - Best Value
 - Lowest Responsible
- No post-bid modifications

ETC.

- Consider Safety record (but not experience modifier - 2023 change)
- Permits Unit Price Contract
- Change Orders 25% limit +/-
- Lease-Purchase Real Property
 - limit to appraised FMV

Ch. 252: Purchasing and Contracting Authority of Municipalities

Limited Exemptions

Public Calamity

Preserve or Protect Public Health & Safety

Unforeseen
Damage to
Property

Single source

Ch. 271: Purchasing and Contracting Authority of Municipalities, Counties and Certain Other Local Governments

Applies to Multiple Types of Governmental Entities

- §271.152 & .153: Waiver of Immunity and Limitations on Damages
- § 271.904: Anti-Indemnity for Engineers & Architects
- § 271.908: Private Development Agreements

Ch. 2251: Payment for Good & Services

Prompt Pay Act - Governs Timeliness

Payment by City due 30 days after:

- Date goods are received
- Date performance is completed
- Date an invoice is received

If governing body meets only once a month or less - Payment due by the 45th day following

Vendor & Subcontractor
Payments due 10 days after
Receipt from City

Interest = prime plus 1%

Bona Fide Dispute Exception

Ch. 2252: Contracts with Gov't Entity

§2252.032 Retainage

- 10% Max on Contracts < \$5M
- 5% Max on Contracts > \$5M
- Downstream Cannot Exceed Upstream
- Limits on City's Right to Withhold
 - Bona Fide Dispute
 - Nonconforming Work or Unpaid Subs
- Contractor Apply for Release
- May Offer Offset for Nonconforming Work Items
- City Not Required to Accept
- No Impact on Contract Rights

§2253: Performance and Payment Bonds

Applies to City owned Public Works Contracts

Payment Bond for Contracts => \$50k

Performance Bond for Contracts => \$100k

- Corporate Surety
- Licensed by TDI
- Cannot Specify a Surety

Ch. 2254: Professional Services Procurement Act

- Accounting
- Architecture
- Landscape architecture
- Land surveying
- Medicine
- Optometry
- Professional engineering
- Real estate appraising
- Professional nursing
- Forensic scientist

Qualification Based Awards

- DemonstratedCompetence
- Fair & Reasonable Price

Ch. 2254: Professional Services Procurement Act Cont.

Design Professionals & Lawyers

- A/E or Land Surveyor must select the most highly qualified
- Contract made in violation of §2254 is VOID
- §2254.101 et. seq. Contingent Fee Legal Services

Ch. 2258: Prevailing Wage Rates

Any worker employed on a public work contract be paid at least the general prevailing daily wage rate for work of a similar character performed in the same locality

- Includes overtime & respective overtime rates
- US Dept. of Labor

Ch. 2269: Contracting and Delivery Procedure for Construction Project Methods

- Best-value competitive bidding
- Competitive sealed proposal
- Construction manager-agent
- Construction manager-at-risk
- Design-build
- Job order

Ch. 2269 - Construction Procurement

- Prevails Over Other Law Relating to Public Work Contract
- Delegation or Council Determination Required for Use
- Facility Any Improvement to Real Property
- Production of Documents Relating to Evaluation Required
- CSP Price must be at least 50%
 - Can Lower to 36.9% if City Determines in Public Interest
