

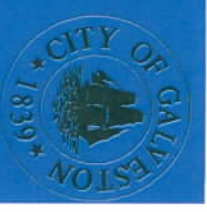

# Trees

- Trees cost \$186 on the average to cut down
- They cost \$106 on the average to remove.
- Galveston lost 10,840 trees on the public right of way
- We estimate 31,119 trees lost on private property
- Total Cost: \$12,377,905 and we lost our trees!







# Tree Recovery



- The National Arbor Day Foundation has donated 5,000 tree seedlings for residents to plant on their own properties as part of Galveston's reforestation effort. These seedlings measure between 12 and 24 inches.
- Residents had their choice between four hearty varieties: Live Oak, Pecan, Wax Myrtle, and Bald Cypress.
- The seedlings were given away on a first-come-first-serve basis. Here is one tree being planted, actually it was donated to City Hall by PEO, Chapter EF.

# Wal-Mart

- Wal-Mart announced a \$2.5 million commitment to assist with relief efforts in relation to Hurricanes Ike and Gustav.
