
ARTICLE 506. Where a town or village may contain two hundred (Acts May 26, inhabitants and less than one thousand inhabitants, it may be incorporated as a town in the manner prescribed in this chapter.

ART. 507. If the inhabitants of such town or village desire to be so Mode of proincorporated, at least twenty residents thereof, who would be qualified voters under the provisions of this chapter, shall file an application for that purpose in the office of the judge of the county court of the county in which the town or village is situated, stating the boundaries of the proposed town or village, and the name by which it is to be known if it






- Tier 1 County County with less than

- Tier 2 County County with a population of 500,000 or more




#### Tier 1 – Exempt Process




## Tier 2 County

- Authority and procedures combined into one
- Three schemes:
  - 1. Petition of individual landowner
  - 2. Area with less than 200 population petition process
  - 3. Area with 200 or more population election process




#### Tier 2 – Individual Landowner Petition



#### Tier 2 – Voter Petition (less than 200 population)

- Only if:
- (1) City obtains consent to annex the area through a petition signed by more than 50 percent of the registered voters of the area; and
- (2) if the registered voters of the area do not own more than 50 percent of the land in the area, the petition must also be signed by more than 50 percent of the **owners of land** in the area.


#### Tier 2 – Less than 200 Population



#### Tier 2 – Election (200 or more population)

- Only if:
- (1) City holds an election in the area proposed to be annexed at which the qualified voters of the area approve the annexation; and
- (2) if the registered voters of the area do not own more than 50 percent of the land in the area, the city obtains consent to annex the area through a petition signed by more than 50 percent of the owners of land in the area.

#### Tier 2 – 200 or More Population



### SB 6 – Remedies

- (a) This chapter may be enforced only through mandamus or declaratory or injunctive relief.
- (b) A political subdivision's immunity from suit is waived in regard to an action under this chapter.
- (c) A court may award court costs and reasonable and necessary attorney's fees to the prevailing party in an action under this chapter.


