

## CARROLLTON

### Introduction

- House Bill 313, enacted in 1999, adopted chapter 378 of the LGC.
- Authorizes creation of neighborhood empowerment zone by municipality



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### Determination

- Establishment of a NEZ must:
  - o Promote or rehabilitate affordable housing;
  - o Increase economic development; or
  - Increase the quality of social services, education, or public safety in the NEZ.

# CARROLLTON Creation • A resolution must be adopted by Council with the following: Determinations set forth in previous slide; Description of boundaries of the zone(s); • Finding of public purpose; and o Finding of compliance with 312.202 Tax Code. CARROLLTON Fee Waivers A municipality may waive or adopt fees related to building construction, including: Inspection fees; o Impact fees; and o Permit fees. Off-site fees could be waived, if they are assessed as a cost of construction within a specified area. CARROLLTON

Tax Abatements

A municipality may enter into an agreement to:
Refund sales tax of sales in the NEZ for up to 10

Abate property tax, subject to the limits of

# Substandard Structures Consideration of substandard building process should be provided for in policy. Has enforcement action started? Is a demolition order pending? Has a structure been demolished on the property in the past? Are there municipal liens on the property?

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### Economic Development

- In comparison to ch. 380 of the LGC, ch. 378 is much less flexible.
- The program is usually based on specific needs of an area of a city.
- Grants of money, except for a refund of sales tax, as an incentive is not provided for under ch. 378.

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


- o Increase participation

- Incentivize redevelopment of NEZs



# Case Study


- Carrollton adopted a resolution establishing 5 NEZs in 2013.
- o Policy provides for waiver of fees.
- In 2014, 414 permits were issued, without fees, resulting in over \$2.6m investment in NEZs. (\$160m in value issued City-wide.)
- To date in 2015, 371 permits (\$3.7m value) issued in NEZs. (\$182m value City-wide.)











Application  A number of other cities have adopted NEZ programs.  Policies vary in accordance with local needs. Some include: Lien forgiveness; Personal property tax abatement; and Criteria parameters and restrictions.
